### Priorities

**2021-2022**

Our previous goal was to decrease the number of students feeling moderate to severely bullying by 2% with a goal to achieve 28% which is the Canadian norm. In addition, based on information gathered by surveys done (2018, 2019, 2020) as well as the pandemic which has impacted all schools, reducing Anxiety is also a priority for the 2021-2022 School Year. Our goal will be to reduce the students' anxiety by 4%: from 26% to 22% which is equal to the Canadian Average.

### Actions / Initiatives to Maintain

- 1 - Unité Sans Violence program with the SQ for grade 6 students
- 2 - Vers le Pacifique Program implemented in Kindergarten
- 3 - Extra-Curricular activities at lunch and after school by reducing the amount of students on the playgroup
- 4 - Social skills groups at lunch with emphasis on particular vulnerable students
- 5 - Leadership students (Prefects) helping out with Kindergarten and cycle 1 students at lunch and various social activities throughout the year
- 6 - Referrals and Co-ordinated Support from Centre Pédiatrie for students and families
- 7 - Ma Cours un Monde de Plaisir for grade 5 and 6 students.
- 8 - Meeting with all students in both group and individual basis to discuss review/actions/strategies (Principal, Behavior Technician, Teachers, Attendants, Surete du Quebec)
- 9 - Communication with all stakeholders (parents, staff, students) to review and reinforce the Anti-Bullying and Anti Violence Program
- 10 - Immediate interventions (when necessary by Principal and/or behavior technician in the event there is an incident of bullying or violence (both victim and student aggressor)

## Actions / Initiatives to Develop

Based on the 2020 Our School Survey results (the survey is a student perception), our goal will be to maintain our previous priority with regards to reducing the percentage of students who feel moderate to severely bullied by 5%. Our efforts will particularly focus on grade 4 and grade 5 students for the 2021-22 school year.

### Bullying and Exclusion (Initial Survey December 2020)

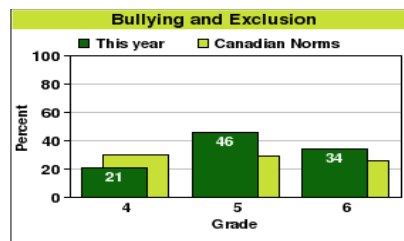
#### **Bullying and Exclusion**

Students who are subjected to physical, social, or verbal bullying, or are bullied over the internet.

- 33% of students in this school were victims of moderate to severe bullying in the previous month; the Canadian norm for these grades is 28%.

When a second survey was presented in February 2021, 30% of students reported that they were victims of moderate to severe bullying in the previous month with 57% of the incidents occurring on the school bus and online (Cyber Bullying).

Our goal for 2021-2022 will be to further reduce the incidents of bullying to 28% or less (Canadian average).



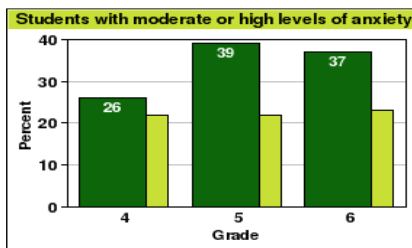
### Students with moderate or high levels of anxiety

#### **Students with moderate or high levels of anxiety**

Students who have intense feelings of fear, intense anxiety, or worry about particular events or social situations.

Our initial survey results in December 2020 showed that

- 34% of students in this school had moderate to high levels of anxiety; the Canadian norm for these grades is 22%.



When a second survey was presented in February 2021 our students showed that 26% had moderate to high levels of anxiety, with most relating to COVID having been eased with the safety/sanitary measures that were in LES.

Our goal for 2021-2022 will be to further reduce anxiety levels to 22% or less which is the Canadian average.
